Andy Grove

- Intel's first MOS dot – an oxide metal semiconductor, dated 1968
- A notebook, and notes pertaining to the early creation of Intel, which includes an organizational chart and list of possible names for the company
- 6 silicon wafers, which are used in the manufacture of integrated circuits and other micro-devices, showing size progression through the years
- Books by Grove, including *Only the Paranoid Survive*, *High Output Management*, *Swimming Across*, *Physics and Technology of Semiconductor Devices*, and *Csucsteljesitmenyu Vezetes*
- Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) Medal of Honor, 2000
- A bust of Grove, as CEO of the Year, awarded by CEO Magazine, 1997
- Six award medals

Hiram Johnson

- Original California State legislation that created suffrage, recall, referendum, and initiative, all sponsored by Governor Johnson
- Johnson's gubernatorial oath of office
- Progressive Party dollar, a blank certificate of a contribution made to the party
- The official primary ballot for United State senate, dated August 29, 1916
- *Johnson for President* handout from the Johnson for President Club of California, with the included article, "To the Women of America"
- Campaign flyer by the Johnson for Senate Headquarters, titled *His Record as Governor of California*, with quotes from Theodore Roosevelt on the back cover
- A mounted and framed collection of election ephemera, including buttons, ribbons, and others from multiple campaigns
- Ballot box and model voting machine, both circa 1920

Rafer Johnson

- The gold medal for the decathlon, 1960 Rome Games, and silver medal, decathlon, 1956 Melbourne Games

- The Olympic torch that Johnson used to ignite the Olympic Flame during the opening ceremony of the 1984 Los Angeles Summer Olympics

Harvey Milk

- Presidential Medal of Freedom, awarded in 2009 by President Obama
