7 The son of poor Italian immigrants, he founded a small bank in San Francisco, which eventually became the *Bank of America*, one of the largest commercial banks in the world.

8 A 2009 **California Hall of Fame** inductee and a former California governor, one of his many reforms included the initiative, making California a national leader in direct democracy.

9 A 2009 **California Hall of Fame** inductee, he was the first person to fly faster than the speed of sound.

10 In the **Three Branches of Government** exhibit, this former governor of California was an actor and later became President of the United States.

11 In the **Uprooted!** exhibit, we learn about the internment of Japanese Americans during WWII and the importance of redress. This US President signed the Civil Liberties Act of 1988, which offered an apology to Japanese Americans interned during the war.
