

# WELCOME TO THE STATE'S OFFICIAL HISTORY MUSEUM

Official state history museum and home of the California Hall of Fame, the California Museum is a non-profit 501(c)3 institution educating visitors on California's rich history and unique contributions to the world through innovation, the arts and culture. Through interactive exhibits and engaging public programs, the Museum inspires visitors to make their own mark on history.

Created in partnership with California Secretary of State, the Museum opened in 1998 as the public showplace for the California State Archives. Today, the Museum emphasizes stories commonly overlooked, reflecting the state's diverse population and the cultural contributions of all Californians.

The Museum launched the California Hall of Fame with former first Lady Maria Shriver and Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger to celebrate Californians who have changed the world. Governor Edmund G Brown Jr and First Lady Anne Gust Brown now serve as Honorary Co-Chairs of the Museum and the California Hall of Fame, bringing their appreciation of the state's past and present to the Museum.

## FEATURED SIGNATURE EXHIBITS

### 1 California Hall of Fame

An exploration of the lives & legacies of Californians who have changed the world & made their mark on history, this exhibit features personal items on loan from the current class of California Hall of Fame inductees.

### 2 California Indians: The First People

Featuring artifacts, oral histories & more, this exhibit chronicles the stories and cultural legacies of over 150 statewide tribes and was developed under a Native advisory council. **RE-OPENING JUNE 27, 2017.**

### 3 California Missions: A Journey Along the El Camino Real

Aligned with State Content Standards for 4th grade history-social science, this exhibit includes rare artifacts from Missions across the state, a cape from the Portola expedition, El Camino Real bell & more.

### 4 California's Remarkable Women

Chronicling the achievements of over 200 of the state's remarkable women, this exhibit was developed in partnership with former California First Lady Maria Shriver and California State Parks.

### 5 Constitution Wall

Sacramento's largest piece of public art, Constitution Wall is a six-story sculpture featuring words taken from the state's constitution chosen to inspire reflection on the rights guaranteed to all Californians.

### 6 Health Happens Here

An interactive journey through all the ways health happens in California, this exhibit explores key factors affecting health beyond traditional diet & exercise through a series of high-tech games.

### 7 Sesquicentennial Quilt

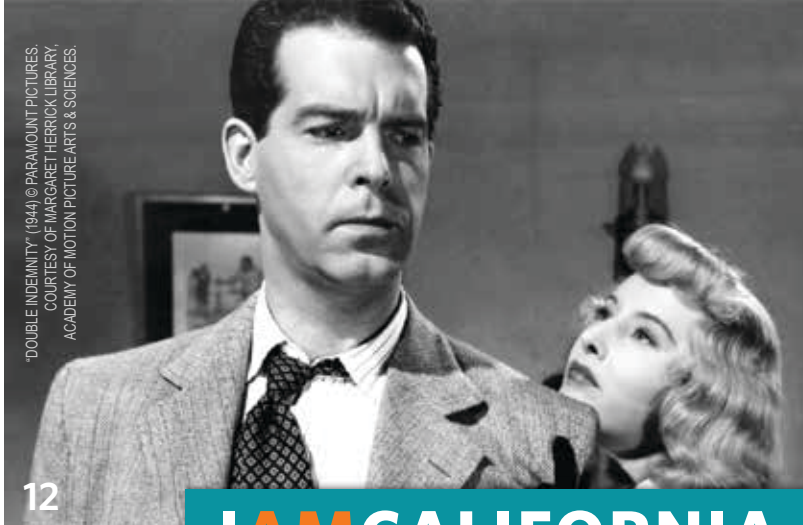
Created to celebrate the state's 150th birthday in 2000, the Sesquicentennial Quilt features iconic symbols of California and its unique regions & the handiwork of over 230 appliqué artists from throughout the state.

### 8 Uprooted! Japanese Americans During WWII

Featuring artifacts from the camps & replica barracks, this exhibit surveys the incarceration of Japanese Americans during WWII, as well as their successful fight for redress for the loss of constitutional rights.

### 9 Unity Center

This all-new 4,000 sq. ft. gallery celebrates the state's diverse people, customs and cultures through interactive exhibits exploring significant chapters of California's civil rights history. **UNDER CONSTRUCTION THROUGH AUG. 25, 2017.**

### 10 Patient No More: People with Disabilities Securing Civil Rights

Developed by San Francisco State University's Paul K. Longmore Institute on Disability, this traveling exhibit explores the significant events in California history leading to the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act in 1990. (7/2 - 11/5/17)

### 11 Art & Advocacy

This new exhibit of original works by developmentally-disabled California artists challenges assumptions on developmental disabilities in recognition of the Lanterman Act's 40th anniversary. (6/15 - 9/17/17)

### 12 Light & Noir: Exiles & Émigrés in Hollywood, 1933-1950

Scirball Cultural Center traveling exhibit exploring how refugees from Nazi persecution shaped Hollywood's Golden Age through achievements in classic films like "Casablanca" (1941), "Double Indemnity" (1944) and more. (5/16 - 10/15/17)
